The DES Tragedy Intergenerational Impact



Diethylstilbestrol/DES

- First Synthetic Estrogen
- Developed in 1932 to relieve menopause symptoms
- Caused tumors in rats
- 1947 re-purposed as a preventative for miscarriages

DES: Assumptions About Efficacy Assumption: Estrogen = goodMore estrogen = better

• Double blind study with hundreds of subjects

• FDA takes no action

 Sales remain high Belief in "wonder drugs"
 Psychological push to have children

1971 Herbst Study

- 1966 CCA diagnosed in a 15-year old girl
- April 22, 1971 article linked DES exposure to CCA
- By November 1971 more than 650 teen girls with CCA
- FDA takes no action



DES Groups Spring Up

• Planned Parenthood, Coalition for the Medical Rights for Women, provide training and support

 Local DES Action orgs DES Watch, DES Action Project, DES Ed Group, DES Cancer Network, etc.

• Early success with states funding education programs

DES Action USA Formed

- Individual orgs agree to come together
- 1978 DES Action USA independent state chapters
- Berkeley "lead" chapter, Pat Cody leads, publishes VOICE newsletter
- HEW recommends Drs. alert all DES patients

What Had to Happen First?

Identify DES-Exposed
 Research
 Legal Issues

1.) Identify DES-exposed

Diethylstilbestrol: The 1st endocrine disruptor -- Wreaking health havoc on 3 generations

- Damages not apparent until fertility years, 15-25 years from initial exposure
- Medical records destroyed, doctors deny
- Massive ethical violations
- 5,000,000 10,000,000 mothers exposed

2.) Research

Education: Outreach Campaign

- Campaign theme: Ask Your Mother, Tell Your Daughter, Ask Your Doctor
- National press PSAs on national TV, newspaper and mag articles
- By lobbying got states to legislate ed programs and DES screening centers
- 1983 (April) 1st national DES Awareness Week held in 29 states
- 1985 President Reagan proclaims National DES Awareness Week held April 21-27, 1985; currently inactive

Advocacy: Legal Advances

- Lobbied and got laws prohibiting insurance discrimination against those exposed to DES
- Change statue of limitations laws NYS first
- 2000 The FDA withdrew approval of DES no longer be prescribed for human use

Research & Physician Education

- Consumer-physician programs to increase cooperation for improving care, and providing support and information for DES Daughters.
- Publishes many guides for doctors and the DES-exposed.
- Sponsored international gatherings of DES researchers
- 1986 1st DES Action Health History Survey released higher occurrences of arthritis, asthma and Lupus than in the general population. Anecdotal but guides NIH research

What We Know Now

DES was the first endocrine disruptor reproductive neurological immune

Maternal estrogen does not cross the placental barrier, DES does

Affected the mother, child and now 3rd generation

What We Know Now

- Cancer: breast, vaginal CCA, testicular, prostate
- Reproductive: Structural changes of reproductive organs; infertility; ectopic pregnancy; miscarriage; preterm labor; preeclampsia, fibroids, endometriosis, late meses and early menopause
- Cardiovascular disease, diabetes, high cholesterol, hypertension, osteoporosis
- Transgender and androgeny
- Emotional impacts: trauma, depression

 - The FDA "fast-tracking" policy weakens testing requirements
 - No long-term testing on drugs before approval
